Comfort Zones:

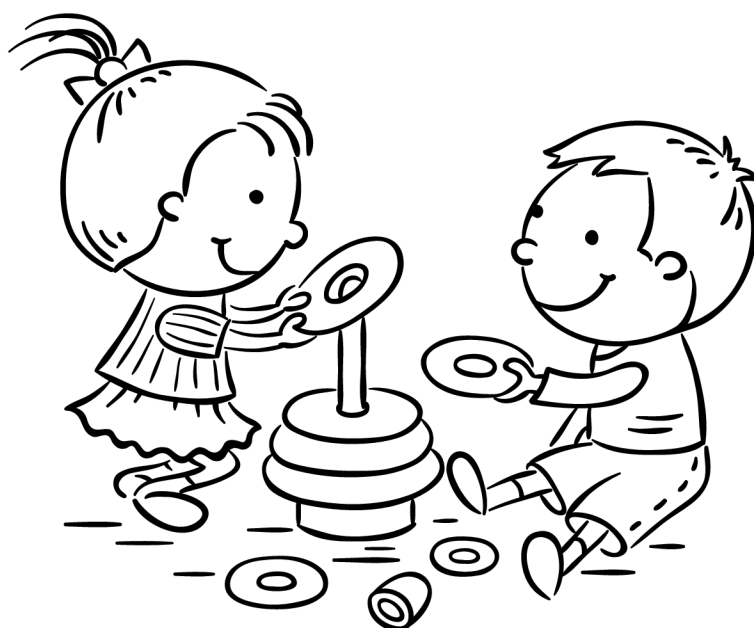
- **Safe Spaces:** Allocate a designated quiet area for children experiencing anxiety or behavioural challenges, benefitting the well-being of all children.
