Here are valuable tips to strengthen your relationship with parents.

Upon Enrollment:

- Share Information:
 - **Provide daily schedules and program plans** to reassure parents about the quality of childcare.
 - Discuss meals and inquire about the child's interests, sleeping habits, food preferences, behavior guidance practices, and any additional needs.
- · Learn About the Child:
 - Gather information to tailor care to the child's wants and needs.

Ongoing Communication:

Regular Updates:

- Maintain ongoing communication with parents, sharing information and discussing challenges.
- Addressing Concerns:
 - Prepare for discussions about difficult issues, considering the sensitivity of the topic.
 - Schedule discussions at times convenient for parents, such as pick-up/drop-off or via phone during the day.
- Discussing Behavioral Concerns:
 - Address concerning behavior without judgment, focusing on facts and appropriateness.
 - Explain potential contributors to the behavior, considering factors like transitions or new challenges.

• Seek Parent Input:

- Check parents' perspectives on the issue, acknowledging cultural and contextual differences.
- Collaborate on realistic strategies tailored to each family's dynamics.



Reinforcement: Highlight Positives:

- **Share positive aspect**s of the child's day, reinforcing the strengths and achievements.
- Encourage parents to share insights, fostering a reciprocal flow of information.
- Parental Involvement:
 - Leverage parents' knowledge of their child to enhance the quality of care provided.
 - Establish a partnership that ensures a safe, secure, and enjoyable experience for the child.
